GREEN LIGHT FOR NEW BUSES?



President's Report

Going Green

As I write this article, the average price of gasoline in Palm Beach County is \$3.92 per gallon, our transportation fuel costs, which include our buses, the security rovers and the COP patrol cars, have reached \$11,000.00 per month. This is not a situation that is likely to be rectified anytime soon. When you compare battery to gasoline power, electricity wins hands down.

A 2007 study by the non-profit Electric Power Research Institute (EPRI) calculated that powering a plug-in hybrid electric vehicle (PHEV) would cost the

equivalent of roughly 75 cents per gallon of gasoline—a price not seen at the pump for 30 years. The calculation was made using an average cost of electricity of 8.5 cents per kilowatt hour and the estimated distance the car would travel on one charge, versus a car that gets 25 miles per gallon and is powered by \$3 per gallon gasoline. One gallon of gasoline is equivalent to 36.6 Kilowatt Hours energy equivalent. If we jump beyond the Hybrid, to exclusive battery power, and realize that gasoline is rapidly approaching \$4.00 per gallon; the incentive to go green gets even better.

Change any of those variables and the relative costs

Committee Plug Electric Transport

As the price of gasoline soars at the pumps and the Village buses fuel bill reaches a staggering \$11,000 per month, UCO's Transportation Committee has resolved to take a closer look at electrically powered buses. Newly appointed Transportation Chairman, Dot Loewenstein, was highly enthusiastic about the possibility of purchasing alternatively powered vehicles, despite a previous lukewarm reception from the transportation committee.

"For those who are unsure about the meaning of green – in this case it means no gasoline, a smaller carbon footprint - in other words, think of our future ecology. Our committee is in the process of collecting information about the possibility of all electric buses, or hybrids which can function on electricity up to 25 mph, but the minute it goes above 25, it automatically switches to gas, which is the cost we're trying to avoid. Dollar figures are

being thrown around for large savings over a period of five years. The bottom line is a high cost up front (transformers, charging stations, etc. plus the cost of the buses more than double the price of the current ones) which will give us the savings within five years and then the savings will continue."

Electric buses are already extensively used in Europe, where even London's famous red buses are now alternatively powered. Highly taxed European gas prices, with an average equivalent of \$11.50 per gallon, is not the only reason for the switch. In an effort to curb global pollution, a European Union directive mandates the purchase of electric buses for public transport.

A feasibility analysis prepared by UCO President, David Israel, concluded, "Those calling for gasoline powered buses in the current financial and environmental climate are on the wrong side of history, and the time for change is now".



So, my friends, get involved, become aware of others around you, and if you have a feeling something is just not right act on it, and please smile if you see me, we'll both feel better for it.


Frankly Speaking.....

UCO INFORMATION

May 6, 2011 Minutes

President Dave Israel opened the meeting at 9:30 AM and introduced the following guests: Sarah Alsofrom, who led the Pledge of Allegiance – Mike Edmondson – Peyton McArthur – Lt. Richard Diberardino. There were 170 Delegates in attendance.

Lt. Diberardino reported that there were two car burglaries of items in unlocked vehicles. Sixteen speeding citations and several seat belt violations tickets were given in CV yesterday. There is an ongoing problem with the restaurant at Haverhill & Okeechobee. The owner has been fined and PBSO is going after the owner of the Plaza. Lt. Diberardino advised the residents to beware of mysterious problems with their cars at shopping centers and people who appear suddenly to “help”.

Minutes were accepted as written as was the Treasurer’s report.

President’s Report – UCO still needs a Recording Secretary. This position is an elected UCO Officer.

Dave called attention to the Mandatory Maintenance Bulletin from American Coastal that was attached to the Delegates’ packet. He then called on Toni Salometo, Insurance Chair, who explained that central air conditioners on the ground need to be secured according to code. Associations are responsible to see that this work is done. How costs are handled is up to each Association. Toni needs to have proof from each Association that they have complied by getting a contractor to inspect these A/C units and made the necessary corrections.

New Business –

MOTION: Randall Borchardt moved that the Insurance Committee chair accept the responsibility for the collection of documentation provided to the Association by a licensed A/C contractor reflecting the inspection and repair for each condominium building and to forward same to the appropriate insurance company. Louise Gerson seconded the motion. Motion carried.

MOTION: Eileen Pearlman moved that all UCO contracts must be approved by the Delegate Assembly before any payments are made on any contractual work. Furthermore before any UCO reserve monies can be spent a motion for the spending of these monies must be presented to the Delegate Assembly for their approval. Jerry Karpf seconded the motion. Motion was amended to read “contracts over \$10,000”.

MOTION: George Franklin moved that this be tabled and Roy Roberts seconded the motion. Motion to table carried.

change. For example, substituting a car that gets 50 miles per gallon doubles the comparative electrical cost (though it still works out much cheaper than gasoline).

There are real issues involved before this transition to green can happen, we would need strategically placed charging stations to keep the batteries in the buses topped off, this will require engineering studies and high initial costs; but these costs would be more than offset by monies saved by not purchasing gasoline over the five years of a typical bus contract.

Not to be overlooked in this calculus is the possibility of Government or other subsidies available for green transportation technology. The Federal Transit Administration (FTA) is an agency within the United States Department of Transportation (DOT) that provides financial and technical assistance to local public transit systems. The FTA is one of ten modal administrations within the DOT. Headed by an Administrator, who is appointed by the President of the United

States, the FTA functions through a Washington, D.C., headquarters office and ten regional offices which assist transit agencies in all states, the District of Columbia, and the territories.

Public transportation includes buses, subways, light rail, commuter rail, monorail, passenger ferry boats, trolleys, inclined railways, commuter vanpools and people movers. The Federal government, through the FTA, provides financial assistance to develop new transit systems and improve, maintain, and operate existing systems. FTA oversees grants to state and local transit providers, primarily through its ten regional offices. These grantees are responsible for managing their programs in accordance with Federal requirements, and FTA is responsible for ensuring that grantees follow Federal mandates along with statutory and administrative requirements.

Finally, I note that my Administration through our Transportation Committee is exploring every alternative to improve our bus service and reduce overall cost.

I do hope that Phyllis Richland's poignant piece hit a nerve. If even just a few residents take her words to heart and look out for their neighbors, CV will be all the richer. But, if it were only that simple. She's absolutely right, of course, these days people don't want to get involved, but there is another side to this vexed problem.

On a personal note, what I find equally disturbing, is the increasing number of elderly residents, some of them here since CV opened, are now unable to take adequate care of themselves and have been virtually abandoned by their children. Obviously, 'the kids' themselves have grown older, but that doesn't mean they have the right to expect similarly aged neighbors and friends to take care of their parents. Nor should it be, as it so often is, that the 'Association' has to step up to the plate. Goodness knows it's hard enough to get board members, but to expect them to act as unpaid care home assistants is simply not acceptable.

In one building alone, an elderly resident flooded the downstairs apartment three times, because she left the

faucet running when she dozed off. She 'disappeared' for three days, causing a great deal of problems for her friends, the association and emergency services.

Thankfully, she was found, having decided to take a lone trip. The following week she wrecked two parked cars as she tried to reverse out of her parking spot. She locks herself out of her apartment repeatedly, usually late at night, and expects a board member to get the association key to let her in. Her daughter and son-in-law claim she is still more than capable of continuing to live alone and that the association is just being awkward.

Her neighbours don't speak with her any more, because she's rude and uncooperative. Her friends appear to have abandoned her, as personal and social habits are now less than exemplary, and there have been complaints from fellow bus riders.

Sadly, this case is far from isolated, and it is impossible, even with the best will in the world, to give the care these people are entitled to. Yes, of course we should look out for our neighbors but charity begins at home and far too many families have come to expect the community to take on what should be their responsibility.

Classes could be held poolside and buswise. Basic courses like Dislike 101, then an intermediate course titled Abhorrence and an advanced course called Hatred could be part of the curriculum. Similar courses with a degree in Anti-Social Behavior could be offered. When all in the Village are degreed, we can then understand each other and become socially anti-social.

ARTICLE XI

Play Review:

The Cha-Cha of a Camel Spider at Florida Stage

You've probably seen photographs in which the photographer has intentionally blurred the image or kept it out of focus. The purpose is both to be somewhat "artsy" and to compel the viewer to work a bit harder so that his or her imagination completes the picture. The new World Premiere anti-war play produced by FLORIDA STAGE and written by Carter W. Lewis, *The Cha-Cha of a Camel Spider*, is like that. It begins realistically, turns into drama and melodrama, then becomes mystical and, finally, poetic. And one is left to interpret the play much as one wishes.

The Time is "Recent." The Place: "In and around a privatized facility somewhere in the United States." At the opening, a mother (Laura Turnbull) sits at a computer as a hacker. She's there with her daughter (Elizabeth

Birkenmeier). Both have broken into a compound run by civilians who train to work alongside the military in places like Afghanistan.

They closely resemble the Blackwater group, which, if you recall, ran into real trouble when the Afghan government accused it of killing innocent Afghans. In this case, the mother's husband has been killed, presumably by these civilian types, and she wants to find out how/why. The daughter, however, has the mind of a poet and, to use the vernacular, she's a bit "flakey." She carries around what she claims is a human heart. It lights up every now and then, adding notes of both comedy and mysticism that from the outset put the potential drama out of focus.

Two men (Todd Allen Durkin and Eric Mendelhall) dressed in black and brandishing weapons, suddenly burst in and, not without some justification, threaten to kill the pair, who have clearly violated the law just by being where they are. Eventually, a devout Muslim is captured and brought into the compound. He says he is just a

taxis driver who was waiting for his fare, the mother. She confirms it. All this eventually gets sorted out in a way that is very colorful and curious, to say the least.

The acting is fine, although Ms. Birkenmeier seems to be younger than the age she's supposed to be. Louis Tyrrell's directing is on the money, and the technical things are also as they ought to be: In this instance, they are the most impressive part of the show.

I suppose that one would have to call this an experimental work, but I wish the playwright had cleared up more of his blurred imagery. If you enjoy confusing anti-war plays, this is for you.

LENORE VELCOFF

Nemesis by Philip Roth is set in the Weequahic neighborhood of Newark, New Jersey (Roth's birthplace and mine).

This is a novella that tells the story of a young man, Bucky Cantor, who was kept out of the army during WWII by his poor eyesight. During the early summer of 1944 he worked as a playground director in an outdoor program for children and he watched as a polio epidemic struck. It maimed and killed several of his charges. As his friends storm Omaha beach, Cantor has his own battle — one of conscience. Should he abandon the city and the kids

and take a counselor's job in the Poconos as urged by his fiancée?

Just as lawmakers considered quarantining entire communities to stop the spread of the virus and people like Bucky fled cities in hopes of avoiding infection, no one at that time could suppress the realities of polio. Why did polio kill some people, maim others and leave others alone? In 2011, we still do not know. Fear of polio haunted my childhood. Later in life I came to know those who had the disease as children and were affected by it for the rest of their lives.

I felt sympathy, irritation, affection and pity for Roth's protagonist and believe that this is the best of the four recent "short novels" by this author. His unpleasant old man obsessions (barely believable affairs with much younger women, prostate trouble, declining sex drives) are nowhere to be found here. Though he may not be the writer of the same quality that he was when he wrote about Weequahic High School (which I attended) fifteen years ago, I feel he is still the most significant living American novelist. Read *Nemesis* and see what you think.

UCO officers: The office is open 20 hours a week with mostly volunteer help. Our



Insurance Committee

URGENT: MANDATORY INSURANCE CHECK

We have been advised that American Coastal, our property insurer, has inspected our properties and has found some air conditioning units on the ground that are not properly secured and pose a hazard if there is a wind storm/hurricane.

This recommendation is mandatory for all A/C units on the ground to be inspected by a licensed air conditioning contractor and secured if they do not meet the necessary wind storm standards. It is necessary that all units meet the standard.

Failure to comply with this recommendation is possible grounds for cancellation, or non-renewal. They have given us 60 days to comply with this recommendation. Our completion date is 6-1-11 to advise our agent.

UCO and the Bid Committee have reviewed the bids from three licensed air conditioning contractors but you are free to choose any licensed air conditioning contractor you would prefer. They are:

Aztil Air Conditioning \$89.00 per unit 561 433-2197 Jason

*Gotham (Kilcoyne's A/C)
\$75.00 per unit 561 575-2653
Robin*

Triton Associates \$45.00 per unit 561 282-0440 Jay

All of these contractors have been advised of what is necessary to complete the job and have agreed to inspect all ground units and only charge for repairing units that fail to meet the wind standard.

As of the last revision of #718, the responsibility for air conditioners falls to the Associations in case of a covered loss. Therefore, the expenses should be borne by the Association and not the individual unit owner.

If you or your Association has questions or would like us to help, please call the Insurance Committee at 683-9189 ext 150 or 151 for assistance. You need to advise us that the work has been completed. Again, our completion date is 6-1-11 to advise our agent.



Maintenance Committee

Our association insurance carriers have required that all air conditioning condenser /compressors that are located on concrete slabs adjacent to the two-story buildings be inspected and secured with Florida Building Code approved fasteners. Those not meeting Code, must be properly secured to prevent them from being dislodged during a wind storm and become damaging missiles to person and / or property, incurring liability damage and claims that will surely increase insurance costs. In most cases, this may involve only one or two compressors, with funding perhaps, provided from the excess insurance return.

The remedy has been estimated at approximately \$45.00 per affected compressor.

Customarily, all sorts of advice are offered re: preparation for the rainy season that includes both hype and the need for effective preparation for a possible hurricane. After the 2004 / 2005 seasons, Publix and other supermarkets installed large electric generators to both protect their perishable and frozen products while supplying their customer's access to necessary merchandise as well as maintaining continued business activity. The need to stock up on goods has been greatly diminished while the need to prepared remains. If an electric outage occurs, we should be prepared as follows:

- Store drinking water sufficient for 3 to 5 days and a fresh supply of batteries.

- Reduce the quantity of food in your freezer and replace the space with containers of water, that when frozen will keep the remaining contents cold longer until consumed or till the electricity is restored.

- Since our summer population is low and includes many elderly, we should look in on our neighbors to aid in reassuring their safety and comfort until CERT and the Red Cross can provide assistance.

- Those with ground-mounted AC condenser/compressors on concrete pads that were secured properly, should have air conditioning restored with the return of electric service, however, those whose units were not secured as required by the association insurance carrier may find that their condenser/compressor was ripped off the pad and unfortunately destroyed, will have to rely on electric fans. Call a licensed AC repairman and do not approach the exposed electric wires. Expect higher insurance premiums.

- When the electric service is interrupted it is important that we open the door to the Circuit Breaker Load Center, most probably located in the hallway and flip to the OFF position, the breakers that control the AC unit, range and water heater, so that when the service is restored, a power surge will be minimized thereby preventing an unnecessary outage that could require an electrician to make costly wiring repairs. When lighting is restored, return the breakers position to ON .

This will be a time for our community to show cooperation and compassion to those who cannot help themselves. Calm heads prevail and awareness leads to good decision-making. Association Officers should notify absentee unit owners of the need to inform their insurance carrier before a significant passage of time. Accumulated water should be quickly removed and dried, avoiding mold / mildew.



Community Emergency Response Team

The Earthquake and Radiation emitted in the atmosphere in Japan got me thinking about Hazards that exist in the United States.

The Community Emergency Response Team Training includes hazards material incidents. The March CERT meeting dealt with this relevant topic.

Potential sources of hazard materials can include:

- Local gas stations that store and dispense gasoline and diesel fuel
- Hospitals, which store a range of radioactive and flammable materials.
- Transport vehicles, trucks, trains, aircraft and ships.
- Chemical Plants
- Hazard materials incidents can range from a chemical spill on a highway to groundwater contamination by naturally occurring methane gas. Hazards materials incidents can occur anywhere.

Steps to take in case of an incident:

1. Leave the area immediately. Then report the incident, call 911
2. If you are caught outside, remember that gases and mists are heavier than air. Try to stay uphill, up wind, at least 1/2 mile from the area.
3. If you are in a vehicle, stop and find shelter in a permanent building, if possible. If you must remain in your car, keep car windows and vents closed and shut off the air conditioner and heater.
4. Call the 24-hour poison control center at 1-800-222-1222. If you need answers to questions
5. Call 911 if you need immediate help.

Be Careful What You Wish For

There was a motion raised from the floor at the Delegate Assembly, the essence of the motion was that "all contracts" had to be approved by the Delegate Assembly prior to signing. The motion was tabled due to lack of quorum.

There has been pot stirring for weeks over the work underway by UCO to effect long neglected rehabilitation of the Roadways. Therein lies a tale: As for the Roadway money, the Roadway Reserve has been approved by the Delegate Assembly for many years, every year in our Budget Build process, the Delegates have approved the contribu-

tion of about \$5.00 per unit per month; reserved for Roadway repair.

Currently there is some \$3,000.000.00 in this fund, and due to the flooding, the potholes, the cracked walkways, leading to slip and falls, the LCAM, the Bid Committee, and the Officers decided that it was time to start roadway repair; that is the responsibility that you The People placed on your Officers when you voted. It is interesting to note that the very people complaining about this process did absolutely nothing to correct the problems when they were in office.

We engaged an engineering firm, which was selected based on Bid process, to study the entire problem,

the engineers noted that the Swales and Drainage had to be corrected prior to actual repair of the Roadway, in order to prevent damage due to flooding.

So, we have commenced the project, based on years of approval by the Delegates of the funding of the reserve line.

So, what exactly have we done that is wrong? In light of a legal opinion by the UCO Attorney that states that the yearly approval on the Reserve funding line, done as part of the standard Budget Build, gives us authority to spend the money on the designated repair, without asking for yet a second authorization, absolutely nothing has been done wrong!

It is important, that thinking unit owners separate reason and law from the pot stirring of a few malcontents!

If this sort of constraint is observed to an extreme, many expenditures, required for emergency repairs or day to day operations would be slowed to the tempo of our monthly meeting cycle; for example, when a 36 inch drain collapsed at Oxford 100, and a large sinkhole opened up; it had to be fixed, now!

Another interesting outcome of this motion if it passes, would be the problem of escalating gas prices, which are now running ahead of our budgeted level of \$3.50 per gallon. This requires diversion of certain

funds not budgeted; should we stop the operation of the Buses, the Rover and the COP vehicles so we can ask for permission to spend the funds which exceed the Budget allocation??

You, the unit owners and your Delegates voted us in to execute the daily tasks of operation of the Village; the proper fruit of our intimate knowledge of the situation is action!

So, again I entreat you all, don't let a minority of malcontents drive you to unreasonable conclusions. Of course, if you disagree, the elections are not that far away; the choice will be yours.

What color is your recyclable trash?



Our golf course - so far so good - but it's not over yet

11) The Palm Beach County Zoning Board has demonstrated its fairness and impartiality. In addition to its recent favorable decision concerning our 'Golf's Edge' matter, it has also just in early, 2011 issued a 'Mizner Trail Golf Course' decision.

2) The legal precedent is "on point": Same circumstances, same state & county, same zoning board, same zoning code, same year, same size golf course; an inadvertent, lucky, made-to-order, legal precedent.

3) Its circumstances so exactly replicate our golf course dispute, but for a change of name & address, it is virtually our exact case. A developer had purchased an 18-hole golf course abutting a Palm Beach County residential condominium development, and sought a zoning approval to build houses thereon.

4) Vigorously fought by the developer, and vigorously opposed by the various associations within the development - and the subsequent hearings, etc. - it was just last month finally decided and

ruled that the developer had made an "unfortunate investment". Even the phrase "...in perpetuity" was invoked.

6) Two nice results:

a) I am in possession of the complete, bound, book comprehensively reciting the actual residents' defensive position and lawyer's defensive position in the [Palm Beach County] 'Mizner Trail Golf Course' matter.

b) I freely offer it to our Century Village. In addition to its guidance, it should be helpful in vastly reducing our (otherwise large) legal costs.

c) Where is our developer going? Unless our developer plans to go into the golf course business, the likelihood of another developer stepping into his shoes appears tenuous, to say the least. i) Instead of our facing a decrease in our property values resulting from developer's proposed housing development, we might work out a mutually interesting takeout and instead use the property ourselves to beautify our development and enhance our property values.

d) Caution: "Don't count your chickens before they hatch": We are handed a good

case, but we shall need an appropriate lawyer to oppose a wealthy, very determined, developer who is legally betting "all in" to get his way.

e) In any case, we should not use just any lawyer to "re-invent the wheel". Ours is not a cakewalk. The choice of a lawyer is neither a beauty contest nor a popularity contest.

f) A lawyer's work has already been done; it would be largely a matter of substituting names in its computer.

(1) The law firm used by the Mizner Trail condominium owners would appear to have a successful, proven, track record of blocking a housing development to replace a golf course.

(2) Furthermore, their legal research and legal strategy is already behind them, hopefully leading to a significantly-reduced legal cost for us to pay.

The developer will keep trying, hoping to wear us down. A long fight may lie ahead. We must be wise in the use of our resources, but struggle can be, and shall be, very worth our while. We must wear him down.

RED GRANGE

Picture this. Washington, D.C. Major photo-op. The President of the United States welcomes one of the greatest athletes in the history of the civilized world to the White House.

Richard Nixon and Joe Namath?

Jimmy Carter and Muhammad Ali?

George Herbert Walker Bush and Joe DiMaggio?

Bill Clinton and one of the Williams sisters?

Nope, it's Calvin Coolidge and the "Galloping Ghost" – Red Grange, whose contract with the Chicago Bears gave the struggling National Football League instant credibility in its battle to compete against the proven popularity of the college version of the sport more than 80 years ago.

I met Red Grange at an NFL Alumni Association meeting in Fort Lauderdale, and I've never known a nicer, more gracious individual. We sat and talked for 45 minutes, he answered every question I

asked, and he seemed willing to go on talking for as long as I wanted.

When people learn I'm a retired sportswriter (40 years at The Palm Beach Post, a couple of semesters at The Gainesville Sun while I was attending the University of Florida), they often ask me who were the most memorable athletes and coaches I ever met. Grange is always the first one I think of.

It seems like yesterday.

Some fellow said, "Mr. President, this is Red Grange. He's with the Chicago Bears." "I knew he had no idea who I was," Grange said, chuckling. "Coolidge said, 'T'm glad to meet you, Mr.

Grange. I've always enjoyed animal acts.' "

A few years later (1986), the South Florida Fair decided to have an impressive display devoted to sports, featuring memorabilia from Palm Beach County Sports Hall of Fame inductees Jack Nicklaus, Lemar Parrish, Dick Howser, Rick Rhoden, Ottis Anderson and others, plus an appearance by a yet-

to-be-named superstar athlete who would talk with Fair visitors and sign autographs. The first person I called was Grange, who was living in Indian Lake Estates, near Lake Wales. I asked him if he could come down and told him we would pay all his expenses for travel, meals, lodging, etc. "Oh, I would never charge money to come and sign autographs," he said, "but I'm sorry, I just can't make it. I'm too sick to travel."

Grange died a few weeks later. It was one of the toughest obits I ever had to write. I had to call coaches and retired athletes throughout the United States, break the news that Grange had died and ask them for comments. Seldom have I heard anyone praised so lavishly. Red Grange was more than a great football player; he was a great human being.

The man who became a legend destroying opposing

defenses as a running back at the University of Illinois and added to that legend in the NFL had more class in his little finger than several generations of modern athletes whom I've interviewed possess in their entire overdeveloped, performance-enhancing, drug-fueled bodies. I felt like I had lost a close friend, and the world had lost a true superstar, in every sense of the word.



Expense Reimbursement

It is absolutely appropriate

for officers and directors to be reimbursed for out-of-pocket expenses incurred in service to

the association. Most well-written governing documents of an association will specifically list administrative expenses as a proper, common expense. Such expenses which are considered reasonable, are phone bills, postage, and the cost of office supplies that are purchased by directors for the sole benefit of the association are appropriate for reimbursement.

The difficult question with expense reimbursement is often whether the amount of the particular expense is reasonable. To address this issue

of reasonableness, it is advisable that the association board pass a resolution which sets out parameters for what expenses are reasonable and will be reimbursed, and how, precisely, directors should go about incurring expenses and seeking reimbursement from the association. Since every association is required to provide access and photocopying of all official records, as per statute, upon request within a five day period, it may be considered reasonable to purchase an inexpensive photocopy machine. The reasonable

charge, if any, for each copy of the official records made, should be in the resolution as well. There is also a photocopying expense incurred with notices required for meetings and the board election. It should be noted that the Florida Administrative Code governing condominium association financial affairs requires that all expense documentation be retained in the official records of the association.

Therefore, at a minimum, any reimbursed expense should be clearly and completely documented.

Bolo's ability to help locate the child was helped by the more than 200 million scent receptors in his nose. In fact, a bloodhound's smell is so good and well-regarded that it has been accepted as evidence in court. Also, recently, our three narcotic canine teams located and confiscated 773 pounds of marijuana and \$10,000.

That's a lot of drugs off our streets. Our diligent K-9s typically work 10-hour shifts, but can be called out at all hours of the day to all parts of Palm Beach County as well as other communities if there are emergencies.

All of our canines are well trained and sociable animals who respond to their handlers' every command. A properly trained and utilized police dog can easily save us more than 500 man hours a year.

We value our canines like any other employee, awarding them medals for good work and giving them medical benefits during their years of service and through retirement.

I take the work of our K-9 units very seriously. That's why my agency has long had policies for K-9 use to reduce injuries for those who come in contact with our canines. Those procedures include proper level of command approval, a clear canine-announcement policy, and the recording, tracking, and review of dog bite incidents.

For those reasons, our dog bite incidents are well below the national average for law enforcement agencies.

It's rare for our dogs to bite because their mere presence is often enough for suspects to surrender without incident.

We've had many cases in which armed suspects holed up

in buildings laid down their weapons and came out peacefully once a K-9 was announced. These suspects quickly realized the futility of their predicament.

Similarly, having a K-9 at the scene of an unruly crowd is a sure way to de-escalate the situation.

Our canines also have a way of melting hearts.

They regularly participate in civic functions and educational demonstrations, where they are always well received, especially by children. In fact, one of our bloodhounds, Canine Clue, was recently adopted as an official mascot of Hope-Centennial Elementary School on Stacy Street near West Palm Beach.

We should all be grateful for these remarkable dogs whose courageous and tireless work makes Palm Beach County a safer place.

resident or an officer of the building to check on the resident. Sometimes a neighbor will have information such as the resident is on a trip.

2. In a few cases the resident had fallen and needs help. Security will call for help as needed. (We cannot pick someone up, only 911 can do that)

3. Another thing that happens in CV is residents get lost and cannot find their way back home. Sometimes at night someone will be out walking and has lost his/her way home. This is when the guards will offer help.

Another task that we have is the work related to W.P.R.F. Some pools are available to all residents of Century Village. The Guards lock the pool areas at about 10 PM each night. Swimming is not allowed after dusk except at the main clubhouse. Guest children are only allowed in the guest pool at the main clubhouse all guests over 16 must have a W.P.R.F. ID card to use W.P.R.F. pools. This ID card is available at the main clubhouse

Guards are to remind people that shorts are not allowed into the shows or special

events at the main clubhouse and to remind people that no food is allowed in card rooms or any clubhouse area except for a sponsored event in the Party Room. Guards will be outside the clubhouse after the shows to help control traffic. Security is not allowed to interfere or enforce any private Condominium Association rules. In case of an emergency, call 911 first. Security's main objective is Access to the Village and W.P.R.F. facilities.

may like to know there is presently a bill in the Florida House and Senate to allow open carry of weapons. If and when this bill passes in order to open carry of fire arms you MUST be licensed. Now there are a few states that allow open and concealed carry WITHOUT a permit. Florida is NOT one of those.

Folks this is a warning.. We do not want any problems with anyone. There are many persons in the village that do not like fire arms and they are well within their right to express this opinion. The people that believe in their right to carry a weapon are also entitled to

their opinion.. If anyone wants to hear and learn about weapons I suggest they join the Century Village Gun Club. They meet the Second (2nd) Tuesday of every month at the Club House 7:00 P.M. Members are encouraged to bring EMPTY weapons to meetings so they may be displayed and discussed. There is a guest speaker every month and subjects are extremely interesting.


Some of my agency's hardest working crime-solvers are dogs.

Able to apprehend a suspect, move through tight spaces, and pick up scents undetected by a human nose, our German shepherds, Labrador retrievers, bloodhounds and other canines are a critical part of the Sheriff's Office operations.

On any given day, our K-9s and their deputy handlers are out tracking fugitives and drug dealers and finding missing children and adults. They are

responding to burglary calls and searching buildings for suspects and wooded areas for human remains. They are checking airports, ports, bus stops and waterways for dangerous materials and illegal smuggling operations.



Knives, Fire Arms any type that can be considered dangerous. It has been reported to us that there are persons in the village that are openly carrying

fire arms..Please be advised that Florida State Statue 790.053 (1) states that NO ONE may carry a fire arm openly even with a permit. Law Enforcement Personnel Excepted. Read the Statue if interested. Now some of you

Are you Forgetful?

POLITICAL UPDATES



From Congressman

TED DEUTCH

As someone who believes our priority in Congress should be creating jobs and securing America's economic future, I wanted to let you know that I recently voted against the 2012 Republican budget. Let me tell you why.

According to economists with Moody's Analytics, this proposed budget will destroy 900,000 jobs in 2012 and 1.7 million jobs by 2014. With unemployment over 11 percent in Florida, we cannot afford to go backwards. The

Majority's budget cedes America's economic competitiveness by cutting:

- Education and training investment per capita by 53 percent
- Transportation infrastructure investment per capita by 37 percent

Palm Beach County Tax Collector

Last month we talked about the hardship our national economic problems have placed on so many Palm Beach County residents. Last year over 28,000 property owners were delinquent. That large number represents people and families in distress. It also represents an estimated \$122 million revenue loss to

the local towns, villages, the county and other taxing authorities.

Florida law requires my office to conduct an annual tax certificate sale. The sale is held to collect the previous year's unpaid real estate property taxes and associated fees. The sale must occur on or before June 1. A tax certifi-

cate, or a first lien, is placed on a property and sold through a competitive bid process. The party who purchases a tax certificate on a property does not actually own the property. They own the certificate, the first lien.

A property owner has 2 years to pay the delinquent taxes, interest and advertising fees. However, if the property owner fails to pay all these costs by the end of 2 years, the tax certificate holder can file an application for a tax deed with our office. By law all tax certificates expire after 7 years from the date of issuance.

The tax certificate purchase sale is an automated on-line transaction. Just go to

www.palmbeachtaxsale.com. Participants are required to register and place a ten percent deposit of the total monies they plan to spend. Once registered, a participant can view a list of all tax certificates for sale and place bids. The tax certificate is awarded to the lowest interest rate bidder. The purchaser has 48 hours to pay the face amount owed by wire, ACH or certified check. Florida law allows a maximum of 18 percent interest but guarantees a minimum of 5 percent.

The success of the tax certificate sale is extremely important to our local communities. The funds generated from the sale help offset current revenue losses from

uncollectable property taxes. This helps local government and independent taxing authorities stabilize their budgets and save critical services.

I'd like to end with some good news. As of April 6, 2011, we are taking online appointments for driver license services only. The new appointment service is a big hit – so much so that appointments are booked three months in advance! To make an appointment, simply go to our website at www.tax-collectorpbc.com and click the appointment button on the home page. We still take walk-ins on a first come, first serve basis.

THE FLORIDA HOUSE IMPLEMENTS CHANGES FOR FLORIDA COURTS

On April 15, 2011, The Florida House of Representatives debated on, and then voted to pass House Joint Resolution 7111, entitled Supreme Court. This Joint Resolution will divide

the Court into two divisions. One division will hear only civil cases and the other will hear only criminal cases.

House Joint Resolution 7111 will also increase the number of justices in the Florida Supreme Court from 7 to 10 members. This will allow 5 justices to be assigned in each of the two divisions created.

Previous to this resolution, the justices were selected by the Governor and the Chief Justice was selected by the other 6 justices. Now all justices must also be approved by the Senate before election

into office is confirmed. The Senate will have 90 days to override any choice selected by the Governor. The Chief Justice will now be selected by the Governor as well.

Funding for the judicial branch is currently at the discretion of the legislature. This resolution will require that 2.25% of general revenue funds are appropriated to the Florida courts. This would allow recurring funding of approximately \$1.6 million to be allocated to the courts starting the first full fiscal year. Opponents believe that this resolution is a way for

politically motivated members to appoint justices who favor their programs and issues.

Members of the minority party voted unanimously against this resolution when it came to the floor on Friday stating that using the court system for politically motivated purposes is wrong regardless of partisanship.

House Joint Resolution 7111 passed along party lines Friday with a final vote of 79 yeas and 38 nays.

Sports Tips for Seniors

It may have been a few years since your glory days as the first-string quarterback or star of the track team, but if you are a senior you shouldn't let advancing age prevent you from being active.

Participating in sports can actually help reduce some of the aches, pains and stiffness associated with getting older, even if you have chronic illnesses such as heart disease, arthritis or diabetes. Regular exercise also can help you stay independent and may decrease anxiety and depression.

It is important to talk with your doctor before starting

any exercise program. Take into account any medical problems and start slowly so you will be less likely to injure yourself. Remember to begin with low-intensity workouts and gradually work your way up. Wear comfortable clothes, the appropriate shoes for the activity, and be sure to drink plenty of water before, during and after exercising.

There are three main types of exercises that you will need to incorporate into your training program.

- Endurance activities, such as walking briskly, swimming, dancing, bicycling and playing tennis, help boost your heart rate and breathing for an extended period of time and improve the health of your heart and circulatory system.

- Strength training, including using free weights, resistance bands or weight machines, helps improve muscle capacity and bone density.

- Flexibility and balance exercises through programs like yoga or tai chi can keep your body limber and flexible, and, as a result, prevent fall-related fractures.

A well-rounded program will incorporate these different types of exercise because each kind has different benefits. Some form of aerobic activity is recommended for at least 30 minutes on most days of the week. Strength training should be done two days per week, but avoid exercising the same muscle group two days in a row. Don't work out if you are sick. Give your

body time to recover after an illness, but resume exercising as soon as you can.

Choose sports that you are interested in and suit your lifestyle, budget and medical background. If you have knee problems, you probably would want to avoid jogging but may want to consider walking or water aerobics. If you are not interested in being inside the gym, perhaps golf would be a better choice. Golf helps strengthen hand-eye coordination, tones muscles in the arms, back and shoulders, improves flexibility and range of motion, and is a low-impact sport. Tennis is another option for seniors because it helps maintain aerobic fitness, reinforces gross motor control, increases agility, and

enhances flexibility.

You will get the maximum benefit from an exercise program if you work out on a regular basis. Make participating in sports a priority, easy, safe, interesting and fun. As you become more active, you will notice that you have more energy, it is easier to do your daily activities, and chasing after your grandchildren doesn't get you out of breath as quickly. 

Meet Your Neighbors: *Raccoons*

About four years ago, the wooded area behind Century Village was leveled and all of the wildlife was displaced. Until that time, we had raccoons in the Village but not in the numbers that have been here since. Animals are very clever when it comes to survival and these furry creatures found that we had raccoon restaurants on every corner. Their paws are shaped like human hands and it was quite easy to open the lids of

dumpsters and serve themselves with the delicious leftovers from our kitchens.

About the time of the forest destruction, I first noticed raccoons that were so hungry they were eating bird seed which exited in the same form it entered, giving them no food value. They literally were starving to death. Walking my cat on a leash late at night gave me an opportunity to observe them as they are nocturnal. They ignored me and the cat even though we were sometimes

very close to them and they went about their business of looking for food. Wild animals spend the largest part of their time just trying to find enough food to stay alive.

Upon close observation, I was amazed at the beauty of these animals. They have a comical face with the bandit mask and bright black eyes. Their fur is long and thick, with a striped tail. They are cautious of people unless they have been feed or get to know and trust people. Many times they know our habits better

Another misnomer is if they are out in the daytime, they are rabid. If they are very hungry and have not found food during the night, some will stay out during the day. Young ones sometimes also will be out. I watched two

young raccoons eat fruit from a palm tree one afternoon. They had found a treat and were having a wonderful time filling their bellies. They were adorable and I had a wonderful time watching them.

Watching them is the key word. The wildlife people do not respect them and consider them vermin. People hunt them. People fear them. They are just a species like all other animals and they can be enriching to learn about and observe. Just don't try to interact with them.
